

TO THE CITIZENS OF BARGERSVILLE:

We, the town board of Bangersville, submit the following information for your consideration. On Friday Dec. 2 we are asking the citizens of Bangersville to decide whether or not we shall construct a water works system in our town. Please study the following:

The proposed water system will cost the town of Bangersville approximately \$18,000. Of this amount we have \$10,000 on hands that is available for the project. This will leave \$5,000 in the town funds. The other \$8,000 will be borrowed at $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ interest, we believe our utility income will retire this loan at the rate of \$1,500 per year.

All of the labor and \$1,400 will be given the town by the Federal Government None OF WHICH IS TO BE PAID BACK.

Water mains will pass before every property in the town. There will be no dead ends mains, this guarantees a fresh water supply.

There are many advantages to be gained by an adequate water supply. Health will be guarded by clean pure water. All properties will be protected against fire. Fire hydrants will be placed within 400 ft of every building in town, thus giving easy access to abundant water supply in case of fire, this protection will reduce insurance rates 25 to 30 %. It will give added convenience to our homes and make possible many modern homes. Property values will be materially increased. New industries will be induced to come to our town. New citizens will be attracted here to construct new modern homes.

Let it be clearly understood by all that it is entirely optional with each property owner whether or not he connects with the water supply. For all who do connect NOW the water will be brought to his property line.

We ask you to study very carefully the plat of the water system submitted herewith. Note that the well is located on the lot south of the Church. The well has already been drilled and an adequate water supply found. The well will furnish 130 gallons per day for every person in the town. 50 gallons per day is the average per capita consumption in towns of this size and character.

The water will be stored in an elevated tank, 100 ft. high. The tank will have a capacity of 50,000 gallons.

The water ^{mains} will be of cast iron and of sufficient size to carry an adequate water pressure to any and all houses in the town. Water will not be metered to residences, but will carry a continuous and abundant water supply at a reasonable rate.

The money of the town is laying in the local bank and is not drawing any interest. Why not use it for it for community improvements?
